Terms of Reference (TOR) for Field Investigators

- 1. Description of the Project:** The position of Field Investigators is to support fieldwork and data collection for an ICSSR funded Longitudinal Study, title of the project: **Coastal Erosion: Adaptation Relocation and Rehabilitation in a Resilience Framework (CeARRRF)**. The study will examine the coastal erosion management approaches, across different social contexts in India to formulate a systematic approach that will be helpful at the national, state and local level. The project is for a 4 years period, and is carried out by a multi-disciplinary research team from, BITS Pilani Hyd Campus, IIT Madras and IIT Bhubaneswar, and AIIMS, New Delhi.

2. Place of work: The Field Investigator will be primarily responsible for conducting fieldwork in Kendrapara district, Odisha.

- Conducting Surveys, Interviews and Focused Group Discussion
- Transcription of data and data compilation
- Assist in quantitative and qualitative data analysis
- Maintaining project database and records
- Coordination and liaising with other stakeholders including government agencies
- Any other project related task assigned by the Project Directors
