The institute had its moments of further glory when Dr. Navneet Goyal, Dr. Poonam Goyal and Dr. Anil Rai were awarded the IBM Scalable Data Analytics for a Smarter Planet Innovation Award 2010 carrying \$15000 cash prize for their project proposal titled "Developing a Smart Crop Management System Using Data Analytics".

Carrying on with their outstanding work, SPICMACAY BITS, Pilani chapter hosted a Norwegian Group *Strings Unlimited* comprising the noted artists Kristin Karlsson, Kristin Skjolaas, Einy Langmoen and Christine Bigjerde. The troupe left the audience spellbound by their splendid string quartet performance.

As always, this semester also saw our students bringing laurels to the institute by winning prestigious awards and prizes in various competitions. To name one in the impressive list is **FIRA World Cup** for Humanoid AcYut 4 designed by BITS, Pilani students. It performed a feat of lifting a weight of 40CDs together, thus creating a world record. AcYut was given a special award by the *FIRA* for setting the world record in weight lifting in the large sized category.

Not only this, the faculty members of the Institute also visited several universities and institutes in India and abroad to broaden their horizon of knowledge and share their experiences beyond boundaries. Moreover, during this semester a good number of distinguished speakers and experts visited our Institute and delivered talks and lectures to share their domain expertise. Faculty members from various disciplines were also awarded grants by several agencies to carry out research projects in their respective areas.

### vision 2020: mission 2012

Towards achieving the goals of mission 2012 project, there has been considerable progress made during the semester. BITS conducted "My BITS | My Voice" engagement survey involving faculty, staff and students of the institute with the help of an external agency, Gallup to assess the experience, expectations and emotional bonding of stakeholders with BITS. The survey witnessed an enthusiastic participation and the results are expected during March 2011 and will be shared with all faculty, staff and students. The university wide Enterprising Resource Planning has formally entered the implementation phase. The product chosen is Oracle's 'PeopleSoft' and the implementation partner is WIPRO. On the academic front, the major exercise of curriculum benchmarking for 30+ programs was completed during this semester. The results of this exercise were shared with the faculty through workshops held in all the four campuses with participation of more than 100 faculty members. Subsequently, some of the changes in the curriculum will be implemented from the semester beginning August 2011. A number of initiatives are being formulated in order to support the professional growth of the faculty and to enhance their overall performance. Our Vice Chancellor Prof. BN Jain formally announced seed grant and sabbatical leave policies for faculty. Proposals have been invited for seed grant support and the submissions are being evaluated. A grant of Rs. 2 crore has been announced by the Chancellor Dr. Kumar Mangalam Birla through Aditya Birla Science and Technology Center of ABG group to invite proposals from BITS faculty for industry relevant projects. Towards modernization of Pilani campus, seven architects were invited to submit the concept notes. The evaluation of these

submissions and finalization of the architect is in its advanced stage. In order to enhance the BITS brand, two external agencies (Perfect Relations and Fractal Link) have been appointed. To support the sponsored research activities, BITS brought on board Mr. S N Zindal in the role of Chief Research and Development Officer. Similarly for the ERP implementation Mr. H Krishnan has been appointed as a consultant. Both Mr. Zindal and Mr. Krishnan come with rich experience in their respective fields.

### DAE Symposium on Nuclear Physics (20 - 24 December 2010)

A four-day DAE Symposium on Nuclear Physics was held in BITS, Pilani during 20-24 December 2010. The symposium was inaugurated on 20 December by Dr. R K Choudhury, Head of the Nuclear Physics Division of BARC (Bhabha Atomic Research Centre), Mumbai. In his introductory speech he acknowledged the fact that

for the first time a symposium was organized in a technical institute. He appreciated forproviding a platform to talk about the language between science and technology. Highlighting the unique aspects of BITS, Pilani, Prof. G Raghurama, Director, BITS, Pilani welcomed all the participants and termed this occasion as a conglomerate of best minds and expressed his desire to initiate a new programme in nuclear physics. The inaugural address was given by Prof. Bikash Sinha, DAE Homi Bhabha Professor, Variable Energy cyclotron Centre, Kolkata on Contemporary Nuclear Physics-Terra Incognitia. In his inaugural speech he reiterated the fact that science drives technology. He also articulated the view that we have a social responsibility and we should pass on the wisdom for the benefit of poor people.

In the symposium there were invited talks, oral and poster presentations on Nuclear structure, low and medium energy nuclear reactions, Physics with radioactive beams, Nuclear Astrophysics and nuclear matter, Intermediate energy nuclear physics, Physics of hadrons and QCD, Relativistic nuclear collisions and QGP, Accelerators and instrumentation for nuclear physics, etc. Around 350 scientists and research scholars working in the field and about 15 foreign participants attended the symposium.

In the valedictory function Dr. R K Choudhary informed the audience that 354 papers apart from 21 Ph D papers were presented. Out of the total 350 participants, 145 were students. Prof. G Raghurama, Director, BITS, Pilani was the chief guest. Dr. S N Karbelkar being the local convener and Dr. D C Biswas being the national convener of the symposium proposed the vote of thanks and shared their experience with the delegates on this occasion.






