editorial

The First Semester 2011-12 was like a six-month long celebration that will be cherished forever by the BITS fraternity because of the memorable events it witnessed. The campus was honoured by the visit of Dr Kumar Mangalam Birla, Chancellor on 13 November 2011. It was his maiden visit to the campus after taking over as the Chancellor of the institute. On this occasion, Dr Birla announced the BITS Pilani campus modernization plan *Parivartan* which includes the construction of a state of the art new academic building besides restoration and modernization of

all the existing buildings and infrastructure incurring expenditure to the tune of about Rs 400 crores. Another major highlight of the semester was the Convocation held at Pilani campus on 28 August 2011. The convocation ceremony, being held in the Institute after a long hiatus of four decades exhibited spontaneous exuberance, warmth and gaiety. Distinguished nuclear scientist, Dr Anil Kakodkar, DAE Homi Bhabha Chair Professor and Former Chairperson, Atomic Energy Commission, was the Chief Guest on the occasion. Over 2,100 students received their graduate or post graduate degree in person or in absentia on this grand occasion.

The semester started with a euphoric and warm welcome to the freshers which included 22 board toppers of class 12 from across the different boards of the country, thus highlighting the institute's long standing commitment to qualitative education. The institute had its moments of further glory when Prof. R N Saha, Senior Professor of Pharmacy and Deputy Director, Pilani campus was felicitated as *Chair Professor* in recognition of his significant contributions to teaching and research work. Prof Arya Kumar was also conferred with *Goldman Sach 10000 Women Awards Certification Honours* for participating in

the mentor development program in the year 2011 organised by London Business School and National Entrepreneurship Network. That research at BITS has gained robust momentum, got evidenced from the fact that in a duration of six months our faculty members went on to bag 12 projects worth 2.04 crore INR. Among the most outstanding achievers, Prof. Raiiv Gupta, Civil Engineering Department secured a prestigious DST project on Aakash Ganga - A Social Enterprise Model for RWH and Agriculture of Low Water Demanding Plant worth 61.96 lacs INR and Dr. Prabhat Nath Jha, Biological Sciences Department, on Molecular Characterization of ACC Deaminase Activity of Associative Bacteria Isolated from Plants of Desert of Rajasthan from Department of Biotechnology, New Delhi, India for worth 40.90 lacs INR.

As always, this semester also our students kept adding feathers to the illustrious cap of our institute by winning prizes in various competitions. Dishank Upadhyay (2008A8TS270P) was appointed by the DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) as the Young Ambassador to Germany for the academic year 2011-2012. Aditva Shankar Raghuvanshi and Aaksh Mohan Singhal (2007A3TS168P) participated in the finals of Intel India Embedded Challenge and won the First Prize in Smart Solution Category, a sum of 50,000 INR. RohitPathak (2011A7PS004P) and Aqsa Inayat (2011A7PS017P) received the prestigious AdityaVikram Birla Scholarship 2011. Besides, 3 students won OP Jindal Engineering & Management Scholarship, 2011 and 23 students received the prestigious Sir Ratan Tata Trust Scholarship, 2011.

In his speech, the Chief Guest Dr. Kakodkar emphasized the role of engineering and technology in sustaining and enhancing the relative competitive edge of our country. Stressing upon the quality of research,

Dr. Kakodkar said that our research should become comparable to the best in the world. Emphasizing university – industry linkage, he said that we should have the presence of research parks in our campuses and national research laboratories wherein our students and faculty may get the opportunity to participate in industry oriented research.

Chancellor of the University, Dr. Kumar Mangalam Birla, in his videographed address, said that in the

next decade BITS will focus on research and innovation. He also recalled that two years ago the Institute launched a major project, "Vision 2020, Mission 2012" with the aim of identifying and implementing measures that would establish BITS Pilani as one of India's top three research led universities by 2015 and to be counted among the leading 25 technical universities in Asia by 2020.

Vice Chancellor Prof. B N Jain in his address notified that during the academic year 2010-11, over 2,100 students have graduated from BITS and about 20% of these students graduated with two degrees under the Dual Degree Program, an option only BITS provides to its students. Besides, 31 students completed their Ph.D. this year. Vice Chancellor, in his brief report, highlighted the key activities of the four campuses of BITS Pilani, while bringing out their achievements, future plans, and the challenges ahead.

vision 2020: mission 2012

As a part of Vision 2020, three years back the institute commenced its Mission 2012 towards which considerable progress has continued even during this semester. The Mission 2012 project is coming to a closure and Mission 2015 is to be announced by July 2012. The Chancellor, Dr. K M Birla along with the Steering Committee and Task Force leaders reviewed the achievements of Misison 2012 in Hyderabad on 26 - 27 December 2011. He noted and appreciated the work done and progress made under Mission 2012. The new curriculum has been implemented for the students admitted from August 2011 and hence significant changes have been brought in the pedagogy and course contents. The course structure for second year onwards is in the process of being finalized. A round table discussion was organized to discuss the directions BITS should take for the development of Humanities and Liberal Arts. The round table discussion is instrumental in designing a new interdisciplinary course on 'Humanities and Design' to be offered in Pilani campus from January 2012. New programs with Post-B.Sc. input for a 4-year Master's program in industryrelevant areas are also under discussion. Before the end of January 2012, Senate approval will be taken for two new programmes to be commenced from August 2012. Academic counseling cells have been formed in each campus and Fine-Grained Grading scheme and a New Student-Feedback system have also been introduced.

The WILP programs are being reviewed in terms of content and pedagogy for further growth and its contribution to the overall growth of BITS. Several steps have been taken to support research at all levels. New initiatives such as research initiation grant to faculty, enhanced stipend for Ph.D. students, seed grants, etc. have been implemented. The efforts to recruit new faculty to all campuses is bearing fruit, as 80 offers have been made. A New website has been launched and new brand guidelines have also been adopted. Considerable progress has been made in ERP implementation and some modules will be introduced in the coming months.

A monumental Project Parivartan, for Pilani campus with an outlay of 400 crore, has been announced and has started taking long strides for its modernization and expansion. BITS connect 2.0, a joint BITSAA international-BITS project has

been initiated to provide multi-campus virtual classrooms, immersive telepresence solutions for cross-campus meetings and collaboration etc.





The elaborate masks, the dazzling costumes, the rhythmic drum beats and vocals, characterized the Chhau dance. A distinctive feature of this dance was the acrobatic use of the body and the intricately crafted masks worn by the dancers.
