Indo-French Research workshop

A seven-day Indo-French Research workshop on "Theory and Simulation of Hyperbolic PDEs" arising in Mathematical Biology and Fluid Flow (TSHPDE-2019) was organized by the Department of Mathematics from January 5-11, 2019. Dr Rajesh Kumar, convener from BITS Pilani welcomed all the guests and participants. Prof Youcef Mammeri, convener from France spoke about the workshop and discussed the possible collaboration between BITS Pilani and French institutions for various joint projects.

Prof B. K. Sharma, Head, Department of Mathematics informed the participants about the opportunity for collaboration and research in interdisciplinary areas. Director, Prof Ashoke K. Sarkar, spoke about the foundation of the institute and suggested the participants to explore the possibility of interaction with national and foreign experts on various disciplines of Mathematics. Prof Fernando da Costa, Chief Guest of the conference highlighted the significance of mathematics in real-life applications and also about the importance of this workshop. There were 6 international and 2 national speakers from various disciplines and 54 participants, of which 3 were from the University of Laos.

Electronics Applications and Real-time Implementation” during January 18-19, 2019. Prof Hari Om Bansal, the convener introduced the theme of the workshop. Prof V. K. Chaubey, Head, Department of Electrical and Electronics Engineering informed the participants about the opportunity for collaboration and research in relevant areas. Prof S. K. Verma, Dean, Administration, suggested the participants about exploring the possibility of interaction/ collaboration with national and foreign experts on various areas of power electronics. Chief Guest, Prof Jamil Akhtar, highlighted the significance of recent trends in device modelling in power electronics. Prof Chandra Shekhar, Senior Professor Emeritus briefly introduced the recent advances in the control algorithms and their application into this domain. There were 60 participants from different parts of the country and 5 lecture sessions from experts out of which 2 were through tele-presence and 6 were demonstration sessions.

Theoretical Chemistry Symposium

The 16th Theoretical Chemistry Symposium (TCS-2019) was organized by the Department of Chemistry at BITS Pilani, during February 13-16, 2019. Over 320 external delegates comprising over 100 faculty delegates (including 4 foreign delegates) 3 industry delegates and over 220 students had gathered for the same. The three-and-half day symposium had witnessed about 24 keynote lectures, 52 invited talks and about 221 poster presentations. Held biennially, TCS has been the largest platform for theoretical and computational chemistry community in India. Vice-Chancellor, Prof Souvik Bhattacharyya, emphasized on the key role of theoretical and computational sciences in

strengthening the ties with other areas of science and technology. Director, Prof Ashoke K. Sarkar, briefed about Pilani Campus. Prof Saumi Ray, Head, Department of Chemistry presented research highlights of the department. Prof Shridhar R. Gadre, Distinguished Professor at Savitribai Phule Pune University and the Guest of Honour for the inaugural function presented a brief history of the symposium series and highlighted how the idea of TCS has evolved over the years, since its conception in 1986. Dr Paritosh Shukla anchored the inaugural function and Dr Prashant Uday Manohar, Co-convenor, TCS 2019 proposed the vote of thanks.

Workshop on Institutional Digital Repository

BITS Pilani Library in collaboration with National Digital Library of India, IIT Kharagpur organized a two-day workshop on Institutional Digital Repositories from February 25-26, 2019. During the inaugural session, Prof P.P. Das, Joint Principal Investigator, NDLI Project (initiated by IIT Kharagpur with support from MHRD, Govt. of India) introduced the project and the various technical requirements.

The project already has over 2 crore digital resources which are most versatile and can serve right from the school children to the research scholars on wide-ranging subjects. Dr Sutradhar, Librarian, IIT Kharagpur talked about how librarians can contribute to the NDLI project by digitizing the contents of their institution, universities, colleges and how NDLI can help the librarians to set up the Institutional Digital Repositories by using open source software such as D-Space and share their content with NDLI. Vice-Chancellor, Prof Souvik Bhattacharyya, congratulated BITS Pilani library and IIT Kharagpur for conducting the workshop for the benefit of librarians and also for their institutions.

He encouraged the participants to implement IDR in their respective libraries. The National Digital Library of India will be used to serve learning content of various types including developed e-content, e-books, e-journals, scanned books, research papers, thesis, etc.

The theme of the Workshop was to enhance the understanding of principle and working of analytical equipments such as XRD, GCMS, FTIR, AAS, SEM, XPS, TGS, DSC and Particle analyzer. 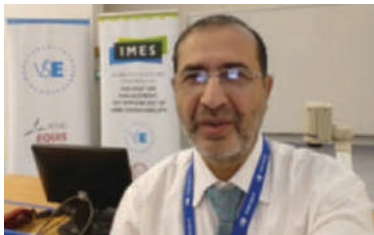

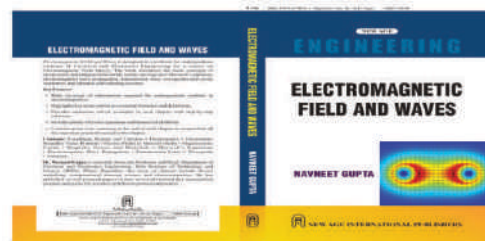
