

RULES FOR AWARD OF MEDALS

1. Three medals – one gold, one silver and one bronze be awarded to students of the Integrated First Degree programmes (Formal) for obtaining first, second and third positions respectively in the institute in terms of CGPA. However, no student will be eligible for the award of any of these medals if his/her CGPA is less than 7.00.
2. In case there is a tie (where more than one candidate qualifies for the award of any medal), the medal should be awarded to all such students, However, while determining the merit of all the students, their CGPA shall be worked out to the requisite number of decimal places until a clear verdict is obtained.
3. The medals shall be awarded only after considering the performance of all students graduating at the end of first semester, second semester and summer term of an academic year.
4. Where a student eligible for the award of a medal is disqualified from receiving the same for reasons mentioned below the medal in question shall not be awarded that year.
5. The following categories of students will not be eligible for the award of medals.
 - (i) Students admitted on the principle of admission with advance standing.
 - (ii) Students who repeat any course or graduate with ‘NC’ in any course.
 - (iii) Students who have been awarded any academic punishment by the Examination Committee or any other punishment on the recommendation of the Standing Committee for Students Discipline.
 - (iv) Students who graduate with ‘CLR’ grade in any course.
 - (v) Students who take more than the prescribed time for completion of their degree programme. The prescribed time shall be reckoned to be as under:

Programme	Duration
(i) Integrated First Degree Programmes	8 Semesters
(ii) Composite dual degree programme	10/11 semesters as per corresponding chart
(iii) First degree(s) along with higher degree	10/11/12 semesters as per corresponding chart

- (1) Any summer term(s) or part thereof in addition to the above prescribed durations if used for practice school courses will be deemed to be 'prescribed time' and will not disqualify such candidates from award of medals.
 - (2) For purposes of determining total duration two summer terms may be deemed to be notionally equivalent to one semester whenever summer terms have been utilized for courses other than the practice school courses.
6. A certificate of merit to every awardee of medals shall also be issued.
7. Whenever Senate approves any flexibility in programmes in which medals awarded necessitating modification of these rules, the rules shall be deemed to have been modified accordingly subject to prior approval of such modifications by the chairman of the Senate.
